MIKE FOSTER Hand Wrist and Elbow Removal of Metalware

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Problem

- Pain or discomfort over prominent metalware or desire not to have the metal in the body

<u>Cause</u>

 Metal plates, screws, wires can often be felt beneath the skin in areas with little soft tissue padding

Diagnosis

- Prominent metalware can usually be felt
- X-rays can show if screws are backing out or if plates are prominent
- Occasionally CT scans are required.

Treatment

- Surgical
 - Usually General Anaesthetic
 - o Day Stay
 - o Metalware usually removed through existing scars

Potential Complications

- Infection, Haematoma, Neurovascular Injury
- Broken screws unable to be removed.

Post Op Care

- Firm Dressing to prevent bruising
- Early mobilisation -
 - Underlying bone should be healed prior to metalware removal
